Additionally, the amendment clarified the appointment of the Treasurer and the need for a final report from the outgoing officer. Finally, the

amendment clarified that all non-executive positions (meaning any officer other than President, President-Elect, Recorder and Treasurer) will be filled by appointment until the end of the current office's term.

President Dave Watters reviewed the background necessitating a Bylaws review. Draft revisions discussed. Recommended changes will be pre-

sented to the membership electronically; 30-day window to review. Plan to email Jan. 25; close voting on Feb. 25.

Amber Sherman, Treasurer, reported total assets of \$15,515.65; does not include monies collected for the recent Keystone. Also reported that she is gathering information needed to complete the state tax exemption application.
