

PCPA > October 2, 2000 Annual Business Meeting Report

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I. Call to Order

President V. King-Garwood called the meeting to order at 12:40 p.m.

II. Announcements

Recorder M.E. Bayuk announced that Past President M.L. Kennedy is accepting nominations through January 1, 2001 for the following positions on the PCPA Executive Board:

Upon election, positions become effective as of May 1, 2001.

III. Treasurer's Report

J. Merkle gave the report for Treasurer J. Puzycki. As of October 2, 2000, PCPA has total assets of \$15, 813.91, of which \$13,833.03 is in checking and \$3,181.30 is in savings.

IV. Membership Report

President Elect D. Wilson gave the report for Membership Commission Chair B. T. Clark. PCPA currently has 228 members (197 regular, 30 student, 1 emeritus).

V. Annual Report 1999-2000

Past President M.L. Kennedy reported that she had two major goals when she took office: (1) maintain financial stability and (2) build teams using the newly created executive board structure that was voted on at the 1998 Annual PCPA Conference at Split Rock. Among her accomplishments she cited the 1999 Annual PCPA Conference at Seven Springs, the very successful Keystone Seminar held at St. Francis College in January 2000 and the fact that she began to tackle the issue of dual membership.

VI. State of the Association 2000-2001

President V. King-Garwood reported that Hidden Valley has been chosen as the site for the 2001 Annual PCPA Conference. The Conference will be held October 7, 8 and 9, 2001 with M. McGinnis as chair. Since May 2000, the Association has unveiled a new logo, a new web page and has preplanned a series of six Keystone Seminars to be held on campuses that the PCPA has never been on before. All six Keystones will carry NBCC credit. The first Keystone Seminar will be held November 10, with a presentation in the West at Robert Morris College, Moon Township and a presentation in the East at the Community College of Philadelphia, Northwest Regional Center. The cost of each Keystone will be \$20.00 for professionals and \$10.00 for graduate students. Lunch is included in the cost of the registration. King-Garwood noted that 23 of the 26 professional development offerings presented during 2000-2001 have been approved for NBCC credit. She indicated she anticipates a full slate of nominations in January.
