I. Call to Order

President D. Wilson called the meeting to order at 12:45 p.m.

II. Announcements

Wilson recognized the conference chair M. McGinnis and the Conference Committee.

Recorder M.E. Bayuk announced that receipts for conference fees were available for those who needed them.

Professional Development Commission Chair M. Burnett encouraged graduate students to apply for the Grady Roberts 2002 Writing Award and provided information about the two upcoming Keystone Seminars on November 2, 2001.

III. Treasurer's Report

Treasurer J. Puzycki distributed the PCPA Treasury Annual Conference Report. As of October 7, 2001, PCPA has total assets of \$11,870.14, of which \$1,805.79 is in checking and \$10,064.35 is in savings.

IV. Membership Report

Membership Commission Chair B. Clark reported that PCPA currently has 189 members (152 regular, 36 student, 1 emeritus). She also noted that PCPA's list serve has continued to grow and that there are currently 85 members, up 32 from its inception. The list was designed for all PCPA members to discuss professional issues and is only open to those with current memberships.

V. State of the Association 2001-2002

President D. Wilson reported that his goal has been to develop a healthier, sounder relationship with ACPA. He also noted that during the past year, PCPA has produced a journal, four newsletters and held six Keystone Seminars. He also stressed that executive board members constantly searching for ways on how to reach graduate students. To that end, for the first time PCPA has an intern whose function will be to focus on graduate students. He noted that 15 graduate students had enrolled in the mentor/mentee program. Wilson reported that the Chief Student Affairs Officer Breakfast that morning had been a success.

VII. Old Business

President D. Wilson reminded the membership that the Member at Large Four Year Public-East position has been vacant for three months and that he is looking for someone to fill it. He also noted that PCPA continues to focus on multi diversity and inclusion and that these are important issues for the association. Wilson reported that by unanimous vote of the executive board emeritus status has been bestowed on three individuals: Frank Bucci, Robert Gallagher and Virginia Scullion.

VIII. New Business

Patricia Steele was introduced as new journal editor. She is looking for volunteers for the journal's editorial board. Jeanne Steffes from ACPA was introduced and welcomed.

IX. Good of the Order

There were no comments for the good of the order.
